STIPULATED FINAL ORDER

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Shelly Arnsmeier (hereafter "CA applicant"), applied for a license as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. The Board and Applicant agree as follows:

Findings of Fact

1.

CA applicant applied for a chiropractic assistant certificate which was received by the Board on January 25, 2010. She answered yes to the question, "have you ever been arrested for, or charged with, a violation, misdemeanor or felony – in Oregon or elsewhere?" In her statement she said, "I was arrested for and plead guilty to acquiring a controlled substance by fraud on October 16, 2008, which is a misdemeanor." She admitted to obtaining Vicodin from a pharmacy under a false premise. She performed 80 hours of community service, a drug information and education program and was on probation for 18 months. She is currently employed in a chiropractic clinic.

Conclusions of Law

2.

Under the provisions of ORS 684.100 (1)(d) and ORS 670.280, the Board may grant the CA applicant certification with conditions.

Agreement

3.

This matter having come properly before and been considered by the Board, CA applicant having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below: IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Applicant will disclose a copy of this final order and the written explanation submitted to the Board to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment.
- b. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of her employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of this disciplinary history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of the final order which may result in further discipline up to and including revocation.
- c. Applicant will undergo urine drug screens with a basic ten panel of drugs specifically tested at random at a frequency of three times a year for two years from the effective date of this order. CA applicant must arrange for and pay for all costs related to this testing by a reputable testing service approved by the OBCE and cause that service to provide the results directly to the OBCE.
