On or about August 5, 1996, a notice stating that the Board (OBCE) intended to suspend the chiropractic license of Dr. Richard Belhumeur (licensee) was served upon licensee by certified mail. This notice alleged that the licensee treated between October 1989, and June 1995, and that licensee failed to honor a request to forward copies of the patient medical records to her treating physician, pursuant to ORS 684.100 (1) (g) and OAR 811-015-0006 (1). This notice also proposed that all money submitted to the OBCE by licensee be applied to settle any existing debts which licensee owes to the OBCE. The notice further granted to licensee an opportunity for a hearing, if requested within 21 days of service of the notice. No such request for a hearing has been received by the Board. The Notice designated the Board's file on this matter as the record for purposes of default.

NOW THEREFORE, after consideration of the records and files of the Board relating to this matter, the Board enters the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- Licensee was a licensed chiropractor between October 1989 and June
