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The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Jonah Buttler (hereafter "CCA"), is a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. The Board conditions Licensee's certificate on the following basis:

Findings of Fact

1.

On July 28, 2009, the OBCE received CCA's renewal to practice as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. On question two of the renewal form where CCA was asked if he had ever been arrested or convicted, CCA responded yes, in regards to an arrest for probation violations in February 2009. In the attached explanation for that response, CCA provided a statement that he had a previous misdemeanor conviction for theft and assault, and was placed on probation, is attending AA meetings, group counseling and seeing a counselor on an individual basis.

2.

The Board finds that the acts and conduct are cause to place conditions on CCA's certificate. The Board may condition a certificate for conviction of a misdemeanor pursuant to OAR 811-010-0110(14)(c).

Agreement

3.

This matter having come properly before the board and been considered by the Board, and CCA having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Under the provisions of ORS 684.100 (1)(d) and ORS 670.280, CCA must fully disclose his conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom he

seeks employment, and that failure to do so will result, after investigation and due process, in possible license revocation.

- b. CCA will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days from the beginning of his employment with any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of his conviction history. a. Under the provisions of ORS 684.100 (1)(d) and ORS 670.280, CCA must fully disclose his conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom he seeks employment, and that failure to do so will result, after investigation and due process, in possible license revocation.
- c. CCA will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days from the beginning of his employment with any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of his conviction history.
- d. By signing this consent order CCA understands that he has been advised of his right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
- e. This is effective on the date it is signed by both parties.
