The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board or OBCE) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon Ross Fitzgerald (applicant) is an applicant for licensure as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant (CCA).

 On September 9, 2003, the OBCE received applicant's application which indicated that he has a conviction for possession of unlawful controlled substance from an incident in 1987. Court records show applicant was fined \$500 and given a sentence of five-year probation on Feb. 3, 1988 for attempted unlawful possession of a controlled substance. It is the Board's finding this is indicative of a serious offense.

2.

 On September 19, 2003, applicant was sent a Notice of Proposed Condition on Licensee and proposed under the provisions of ORS 684.100 (1) (d) and ORS 670.280, that applicant be granted certification with the condition that he must disclose this conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom he seeks employment, and that failure to do so will result, after investigation and due process, in the revocation of his (CCA) license.
