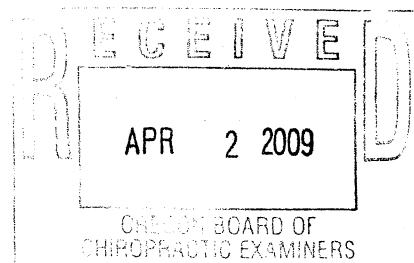

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Lance Hatch, D.C. (hereafter "Applicant"), is a former licensed chiropractic physician in Oregon. The Board proposes the following:

Findings of Fact

1.

On November 27, 2006, Applicant's license was revoked based upon a plea of guilty to one charge of conspiracy to defraud the United States Government. On August 7, 2006, Licensee pled guilty to one count of the information which was a felony in violation of 18 U.S.C. section 371, Conspiracy to Defraud the United States. Applicant was sentenced to federal prison for 20 months and taken into custody. He was also assessed a \$10,000 fine. Applicant was found to have violated ORS 684.100(1)(d) and OAR 8110-035-0015.

Applicant served his sentence in Federal Prison and has been released. He completed his post prison supervision as required. It is noted by the Board that the above conviction did not involve any of Applicant's patients. The Board was presented with evidence that Applicant assisted with the federal prosecution in this matter and was cooperative throughout the federal case. The Board does not have any reason to believe that Applicant will be a threat to any patients in the future.

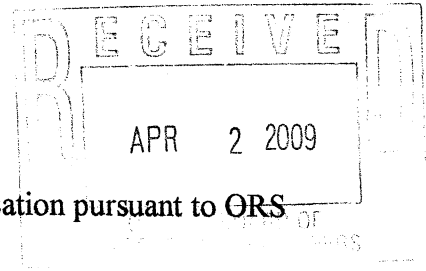
Prior to reapplying for licensure, Applicant requested that the Board review his status and as such, the Board and Applicant have agreed to the following:

Stipulations

2.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board and the Licensee stipulate and agree to the following:

1. Applicant shall be deemed eligible to apply for licensure with the Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners. Applicant will be required



to file all necessary documents for an application pursuant to ORS 684.040.

- 2. Applicant will be required to take and pass the three state examinations and the NBCE SPEC examination to complete his application for his chiropractic license.
- 3. Applicant will not be allowed to: a) operate with any pre payment plans, b) participate in any fee-splitting arrangements and c) participate in any outside sales of trusts of any kind upon licensure. These are permanent restrictions on the chiropractic license of Applicant.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED Applicant may apply for licensure as the above terms indicate effective last date signed below.
