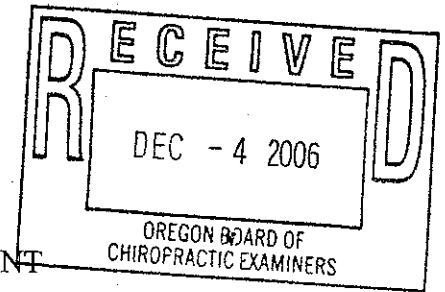

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board or OBCE) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Meghan Holton (Applicant) is an applicant for licensure as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant (CCA).

1.

On October 11, 2006, the OBCE received Applicant's application which indicated that on January 5, 2005, she was arrested while intoxicated and assaulted two police officers. She said one charge was dropped and on the other she was convicted of a misdemeanor for assault-battery upon a law officer and performed nine days of community service.

2.

Applicant states she has got her life together and attended and graduated from massage school and intends to become licensed as both a massage therapist and a chiropractic assistant. Applicant is employed by a chiropractic physician in Portland who has signed her application and verification of employment.

3.

Agreement

This matter having come properly before and been considered by the Board, and Licensee having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Applicant will be granted her license to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.
- b. Applicant's license will have the following condition: She must disclose her conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment.
- c. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of her employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of her conviction history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of this Stipulated Final Order.
- d. Failure to abide by the terms of this Stipulated Final Order will result, after investigation and due process, in the revocation of her (CCA) license.
- e. By signing this stipulation Applicant understands that she has been advised of her right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.

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Effective upon the signing of both parties.
