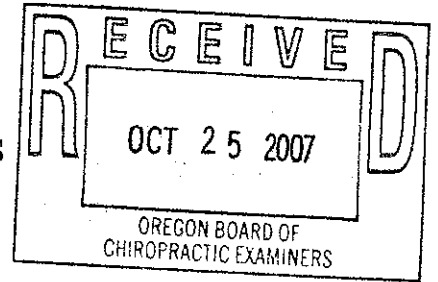

) CONSENT AGREEMENT
)

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Kim MacQuarrie (hereafter "CCA applicant"), applied for a license as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. The Board proposes to grant the license of the above applicant with conditions on the following basis:

Findings of Fact

1.

In the application dated July 9, 2007, Applicant indicated that she is a licensed Physical Therapy Assistant (PTA) who was disciplined by the Oregon Physical Therapy License Board for a) failing to supervise physical therapist aides who then did spinal joint mobilization on patients in violation of OAR 848-020-0060 (8), b) allowing those aides to independently make subjective entries in patient records in violation of OAR 848-020-0060 (10), c) allowed physical therapy aides she was supervising to perform treatments the first time that treatment was done with several patients in violation of OAR 848-040-0145 (1). Applicant received a civil penalty of \$500 for these violations.

Agreement

This matter having come properly before the board and been considered by the Board, and Applicant having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Applicant is granted her license to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.
- b. Applicant's license will have the following condition; she must disclose a copy of this Consent Order and a copy of the Stipulated Agreement and Final Order in Case No. PT 185b-2/05 to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment.

- c. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of her employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of her disciplinary history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of this Consent Order.
- d. Failure to abide by the terms of this Consent Order could result, after investigation and a right to a hearing, in a further disciplinary action up to possible revocation.
- e. By signing this consent order applicant understands that she has been advised of her right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
- f. This is effective on the date it is signed by both parties.
