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12 The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board or OBCE) is the state agency responsible
13 for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Heidi
14 Jean Morin (Applicant) is an applicant for Certified Chiropractic Assistant (CCA).

17 On August 25, 2005 Applicant was convicted of Manufacturing and Delivering of a
18 Controlled Substance (*methamphetamine*), a Class B Felony. Applicant did disclose this matter
19 on her application; explaining the circumstance developed after her husband left her and emptied
20 their bank account; she fell into a depression and lost her job.

22 Applicant was sentenced to supervised probation for two years, and required to complete
23 two outpatient drug treatment programs "Stabilization Drug and Alcohol Treatment Group," and
24 later, "Women's Intensive Outpatient Drug and Alcohol Treatment." Applicant successfully
25 completed both programs— one, in 2005 and the other in 2007. Her probation officer also ordered
26 her to attend Narcotics Anonymous meetings. Applicant paid the fines assessed.

28 Since this matter, Applicant is actively involved in her college education, her church,
29 volunteering two times a week, and taking care of her diabetic mother.

32 Agreement

33 This matter having come properly before and been considered by the Board, and Licensee
34 having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing
35 below,
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37 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:
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- 39 a. Applicant is granted her license to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.
- 40 b. Applicant's license will have the following condition; she must disclose a copy of this
41 Consent Order, court records, her letter to the OBCE and police reports to any and all
42 chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment.
- 43 c. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of her
44 employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been

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informed of her disciplinary history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of this Consent Order.

- d. Failure to abide by the terms of this Consent Order could result, after investigation and a right to a hearing, in a further disciplinary action up to possible revocation.
- e. By signing this consent order applicant understands that she has been advised of her right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
- f. This is effective on the date it is signed by both parties.
