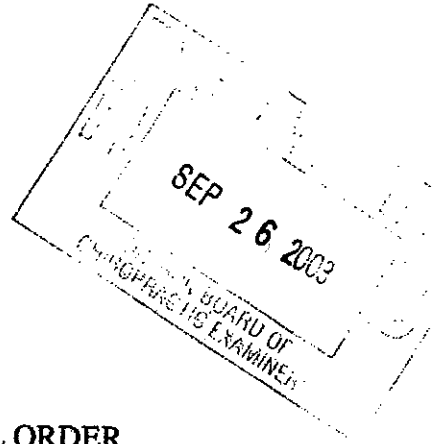

STIPULATED FINAL ORDER  
Case # 2002-5002

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board or OBCE) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Francis Kenneth Rossi (Respondent) is not a licensed chiropractic physician in the State of Oregon. He is a former licensed California chiropractor.

1.

On July 31, 2003, the Board proposed to issue a \$200 civil penalty against Respondent for performing a t performing a chiropractic adjustment on patient 1 and Patient 2 in a statement provided to the Board dated April 13, 2002. The Board alleged both patients were treated in Respondent's home on a couch and each donated \$30 to the Myrtle Point veterans memorial as payment for the treatment. Respondent denied performing a chiropractic adjustment on Patients 1 and 2 and charging for those treatments.

On August 26, 2003, Respondent answered and denied performing said chiropractic adjustments, instead stated, he "used natural means to alleviated pain until (Patient 1) could see a licensed physician." Respondent denied performing a chiropractic adjustment on Patients 1 & 2 and charging for those treatments.

3.

The Board alleged violations of Oregon Revised Statutes ORS 684.020 (prohibits unlicensed practice of chiropractic) and OAR 811-35-0015 (14). Respondent denies and disputes these violations.

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4.

Stipulations

This matter having come properly before and been considered by the Board, and Licensee having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The Board will take no further action concerning these allegations.
- 2. Respondent agrees that he not will not engage in the practice of chiropractic in Oregon without first obtaining a valid Oregon license.
- 3. By signing this stipulation the respondent understands that he has been advised of his right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
