 - c. Checking persons' leg length, sometimes referred to as a Deerfield check;

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Due to the aforementioned violations, the OBCE proposes to require Respondent to pay a civil penalty in the sum of \$10,000 to the Board. This is pursuant to authority under ORS 684.100(9). Payment of the civil penalty is due within 30 days of this order becoming final.

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Respondent shall pay costs of this disciplinary proceeding, including investigative costs and attorney fees pursuant to ORS 684.100(9)(g).

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41 42 43 Respondent has the right, if Respondent requests, to have a formal contested case hearing before the Office of Administrative Hearings to contest the matter set out above. At the hearing, Respondent may be represented by an attorney and subpoena and cross-examine witnesses. That request for hearing must be made in writing to the OBCE, must be received by the OBCE within 30 days from the mailing of this notice (or if not mailed, the date of personal service), and must be accompanied by a written answer to the charges contained in this notice.

The answer shall be made in writing to the OBCE and shall include an admission or denial of each factual matter alleged in this notice, and a short plain statement of each relevant affirmative defense Respondent may have. Except for good cause, factual matters alleged in this

notice and not denied in the answer will be considered a waiver of such defense; new matters alleged in this answer (affirmative defenses) shall be presumed to be denied by the agency and evidence shall not be taken on any issue not raised in the notice and answer. 9.
