The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Ada Carolina Umanzor Sosa (hereafter "Applicant"), applied for a license as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon.

Findings of Fact

1.

On February 2, 2017, the Board received Applicant's application for a certificate to practice as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. On question five of the application, where Applicant was asked if she had ever been arrested or charged with a violation, misdemeanor or felony, Applicant responded yes. However, when she answered the question more fully, Applicant only divulged a March 2016 arrest for Theft 2 misdemeanor and failed to disclose she also had a November 30, 2016 arrest for Theft 1 Felony. Investigation showed that Applicant was charged with Theft in the 2nd degree on February 24, 2016, in Washington County in case D 1607231M. Applicant pled guilty to that offense. On December 7, 2016, Applicant was charged with Theft in the First Degree for suspicious transactions that occurred while she was a cashier at Macy's in Washington County, in case 16CR77881. The allegations were that Applicant was switching tags and selling items for lower prices. The Grand Jury returned an indictment for a misdemeanor, theft in the second degree. There was a May 2017 trial date set in this matter. Applicant did not divulge this charge in her application. On January 7, 2017, the Board inquired of Applicant to provide a written explanation as to the circumstances of her conviction and arrest history and she did not respond to the December 2016 charge.

2.

The Board was concerned at Applicant's untruthfulness in her application and Applicant's arrest/conviction history and the types of arrests that were made by law enforcement.

On April 18, 2017, the Board served Applicant with a Proposed Denial of Certificate. In that proposed denial, the Board indicated to Applicant that if she did not request a hearing the Board would use their file herein as evidence for a default order. Applicant did not request a hearing.
