The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board" or "OBCE") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians and certified chiropractic assistants in the State of Oregon. Theresa Ann Stein (hereafter "CCA applicant"), applied for a license as a certified chiropractic assistant in Oregon. The Board proposes to grant the certificate of the above applicant with conditions on the following basis:

Findings of Fact

1.

In the application provided on December 4, 2006, Applicant indicated that she was treated for substance abuse stating that she had gone through a family drug court in Clackamas County. Through inquiry by the Board, it was discovered that in 2004, Applicant had been reported to the State for drug use which resulted in custody issues with her children. As a result of that, she was required to be in a drug program for over a one year period and successfully completed it receiving a certification.

Conclusions of Law

2.

The above conduct is in violation of ORS 684.100(1)(f), ORS 684.100(1)(g)(A) and OAR 811-035-0015(13).

Agreement

3.

This matter having come properly before the board and been considered by the Board, and Applicant having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Applicant is granted her certificate to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.

- b. Applicant's license will have the following condition; she must disclose her drug treatment history to any and all chiropractic physicians with who she seeks employment.
- c. Applicant agrees to provide urinalysis for a total of two times within the next one year period collected by Recovery Support Services (Rick Weidlich, 503-892-9717). Applicant must obtain the first test within five days of the signing of this order. Applicant will obtain the 2<sup>nd</sup> test within five days after being requested by the Board. Licensee agrees that a medical review officer, arranged through Mr. Weidlich, will interpret the results of the drug screens if needed. Expense of the urinalysis will be bore by Applicant. The results of the urinalysis will be authorized to be sent to the Board and Applicant waives any privilege with respect to the treatment information in favor of the Board.
- d. Applicant also agrees to refrain from use of any medications or drugs that were not properly prescribed for a therapeutic purpose.
- e. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of his employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been informed of your treatment history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of this Consent Order.
- f. Failure to abide by the terms of this Consent Order will result, after investigation and a right to a hearing, in the Stipulated Final Order.
- g. By signing this consent order applicant understands that she has been advised of his right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
- h. This is effective on the date it is signed by both parties.
