This matter having come properly before and considered by the Board, and Licensee having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- a. Applicant is granted her license to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.
- b. Applicant's license will have the following condition:
- c. She must disclose a copy of this Consent Order, court records, her letter to the OBCE and police reports to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment.
- d. Applicant will cause a letter to be sent to the OBCE within 14 days of her employment from any current or future chiropractic employers that they have been

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informed of her disciplinary history. Failure to do so will be considered a violation of this Consent Order. (The OBCE has received this letter from her current chiropractic employer.)

- e. Failure to abide by the terms of this Consent Order could result, after investigation and a right to a hearing, in a further disciplinary action up to possible revocation.
- f. By signing this consent order applicant understands that she has been advised of her right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
- g. This is effective on the date it is signed by both parties.
