Mr. Whetstine submitted another application for Ancillary Personnel certification to the OBCE on October 14, 1994. The application was returned to Mr. Whetstine due to the fact it was not complete. The completed application was received in the Board office on November 14, 1994. The supervising doctor listed on the application was Gregory Doors, D.C.

5.

On his application Mr. Whetstine indicated that he had been "arrested for or charged with" the crime of Manufacture of a Controlled Substance, Marijuana. He also indicated that he had "been convicted, plead guilty or pled nolo contendere" to that charge.

Lane County Circuit Court records indicated that Mr. Whetstine was indicted by the Lane Country Grand Jury in July, 1993, on charges of: 1. Unlawful Manufacture of a Controlled Substance 2. Unlawful Delivery of a Controlled Substance 3. Unlawful Possession of a controlled Substance.

Lane County Circuit Court records filed on May 24, 1994, indicate that Mr. Whetstine was found guilty of the crime of Unlawful Manufacture of a Controlled Substance by plea and was convicted of that charge.

On December 20, 1994, the OBCE filed a Notice of Denial of Ancillary Personnel Certificate. Pursuant to the Notice of Denial of Ancillary Personnel Certificate, Mr. Whetstine requested a formal hearing.

9.

It is the desire of the OBCE and Mr. Whetstine to resolve the Notice of Denial of Ancillary Personnel Certificate by the following:

The OBCE will grant Mr. Whetstine an Ancillary Personnel certificate to work in Oregon upon payment of the required fees provided Mr. Whetstine agrees to the imposition of probation for two years from the date of the execution of this document.

If during the two-year probation Mr. Whetstine is charged with Unlawful Manufacture of a Controlled Substance, Unlawful Delivery of a Controlled Substance, Unlawful Possession of a Controlled Substance or any other related drug offense, his certificate may be immediately suspended, and after a contested case hearing, be revoked.

10.

The OBCE retains the right to examine the subject of this stipulated order in any future disciplinary or licensing proceedings involving Mr. Whetstine.

11.

Violation of any of the terms and conditions of this stipulation, or any of the OBCE's statutes, rules or code of professional conduct, by Mr. Whetstine during the period of the

1 probation shall in effect constitute grounds for the OBCE's  
2 immediate suspension of Mr. Whetstine's Ancillary Personnel  
3 certificate. In addition, the OBCE may initiate other disciplinary  
4 and/or enforcement actions against Mr. Whetstine as it deems  
5 appropriate.
