8 ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT

9 Richard Balsiger practiced chiropractic during the time when his
10 license had expired.

11 CONCLUSION OF LAW

12 Richard Balsiger violated the provisions of ORS 684.015(1)(a).

13 ORDER

14 Licensee Richard Balsiger is ordered to pay a fine of \$200 and a
15 letter of reprimand shall be placed in his permanent license file.
