The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) proposes to 5 revoke the license of Dennis Lynn Campbell (licensee) to practice chiropractic for the following reasons: On March 8, 1990, at his chiropractic offices located at 8 2015 Market Street, N.E., Salem, Marion County, Oregon, licensee 10 committed the crime of possession of a controlled substance, Schedule II, Cocaine. Licensee was arrested in his office by law enforcement officers at that time. From at least July of 1989, until March 8, 1900, licensee .3 (2) 14 regularly ingested cocaine both at his residence and at his clinic, 15 thereby committing the crime of possession of a controlled 16 substance, Schedule II, Cocaine. Between July of 1989, and March 8, 1940, licensee issued 17 18 pain medication prescriptions for patients and had the patients 19 return to his office with the filled out prescriptions. Licensee 20 would remove some of the pain medication pills for his own use and 21 return the balance to the patients, without their knowledge. 22 above described acts of licensee constitute unprofessional or 23 dishonorable conduct or practice which does or might constitute a 24 danger to the health or safety of patients or the public, or which 25 might impair licensee's ability to safely and skillfully practice 26 chiropractice in violation of ORS 686.100(1)(g)(A), in that cocaine
