4 of the License of DENNIS LYNN) ORDER
5 CAMPBELL, D.C.)

6 The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) hereby
7 suspends the license of Dennis Lynn Campbell, D.C. ("licensee") to
8 practice chiropractic effective upon service of a copy of this order
9 on licensee for the following reasons:

10 1. On March 8, 1990, in Marion County, Oregon, at his
11 chiropractic offices located at 2015 Market Street, N.E., Salem,
12 Oregon, licensee committed the crime of possession of a controlled
13 substance, Schedule II, Cocaine. Licensee was arrested in his
14 office by law enforcement officers at that time.

15 2. From at least July of 1989, until March 8, 1990, licensee
16 regularly ingested cocaine both at his residence and at his clinic,
17 thereby committing the crime of possession of a controlled
18 substance, Schedule II, Cocaine.

19 3. Between July of 1989, and March 8, 1990, licensee issued
20 pain medication prescriptions for patients and had the patients
21 return to his office with the filled out prescriptions. Licensee
22 would remove some of the pain medication pills for his own use and
23 return the balance to the patients, without their knowledge.

24 4. The above described acts of licensee constitute
25 unprofessional or dishonorable conduct or practice which does or
26 might constitute a danger to the health or safety of patients or the
27 public, or which might impair licensee's ability to safely and

1 skillfully practice chiropractic in violation of ORS
2 686.100(1)(g)(A).

3 5. The above described acts of licensee constitute a clear
4 and present danger to the health or safety of the public (including
5 chiropractic consumers) and, unless suspended by the Board, licensee
6 likely would continue to so act and thereby would continue to
7 present a serious danger to the health or safety of the public.
8 Therefore, the Board is authorized to immediately suspend licensee's
9 license pursuant to ORS 183.430(2) and ORS 684.100(3).

10 6. Licensee has the right, if licensee requests, to have a
11 hearing pursuant to ORS 183.430(2) and OAR 137-03-010 as soon as
12 practicable to contest this suspension order. Such a request must
13 be made in writing and must be received in the Board's office no
14 more than 90 days after the effective date of this notice. If not
15 so received, licensee's right to a hearing under ORS chapter 183
16 will be waived. If licensee timely requests a hearing, the hearing
17 could be consolidated with any other Board proceeding affecting the
18 licensee. The procedures for a consolidated hearing shall be those
19 applicable to the other proceeding affecting the license. Licensee
20 may elect to be represented by counsel and to respond and present
21 evidence and argument on all issues involved. If licensee requests

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1 a hearing, the procedures governing such a hearing will be provided
2 to the licensee prior to the date, time and place of hearing.

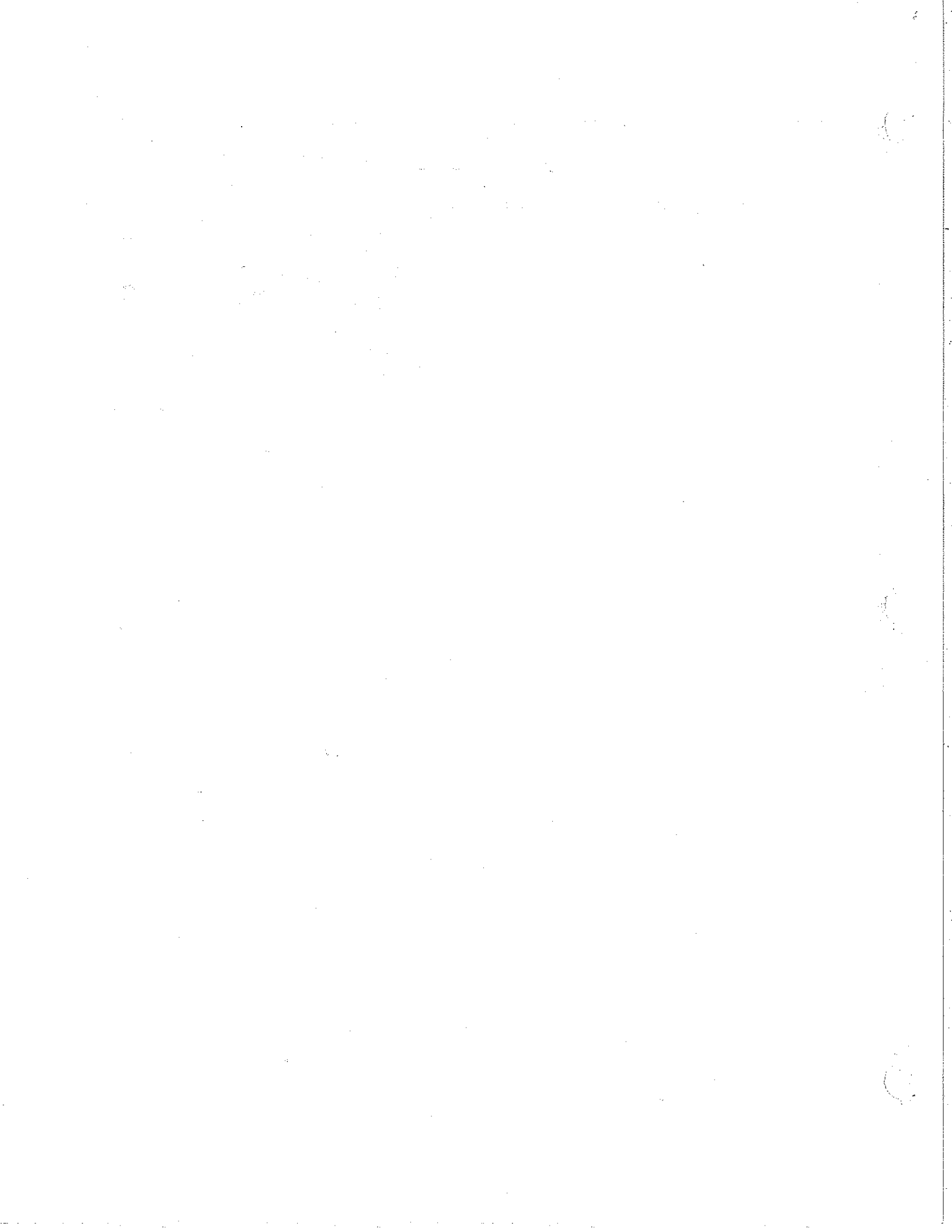

In the Matter of the Suspension) NOTICE OF PROPOSED LICENSE
of the License of DENNIS LYNN) REVOCATION
CAMPBELL, D.C.)

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) proposes to
revoke the license of Dennis Lynn Campbell (licensee) to practice
chiropractic for the following reasons:

(1) On March 8, 1990, at his chiropractic offices located at
2015 Market Street, N.E., Salem, Marion County, Oregon, licensee
committed the crime of possession of a controlled substance,
Schedule II, Cocaine. Licensee was arrested in his office by law
enforcement officers at that time.

(2) From at least July of 1989, until March 8, 1990, licensee
regularly ingested cocaine both at his residence and at his clinic,
thereby committing the crime of possession of a controlled
substance, Schedule II, Cocaine.

(3) Between July of 1989, and March 8, 1990, licensee issued
pain medication prescriptions for patients and had the patients
return to his office with the filled out prescriptions. Licensee
would remove some of the pain medication pills for his own use and
return the balance to the patients, without their knowledge. The
above described acts of licensee constitute unprofessional or
dishonorable conduct or practice which does or might constitute a
danger to the health or safety of patients or the public, or which
might impair licensee's ability to safely and skillfully practice
chiropractic in violation of ORS 686.100(1)(g)(A), in that cocaine

1 and/or pain medication prescription drugs can have the affect of
2 altering the user's awareness of his surroundings, including proper
3 diagnostic and therapeutic techniques and are/or may be addictive.

4 (4) The Board also proposes to assess against Dennis Lynn
5 Campbell, D.C. a civil penalty in an amount not to exceed \$1,000 as
6 well as the costs of the disciplinary proceedings.

7 (5) Licensee has the right, if licensee requests, to have a
8 contested case hearing pursuant to ORS chapter 183 and OAR 137 (the
9 Attorney General's Model Rules of Procedure). Such a request must
10 be made in writing and must be received in the Board's office no
11 more than 21 days after the date of mailing or other service of this
12 notice. If not so received, licensee's right to a hearing under ORS
13 chapter 183 and OAR chapter 137 will be waived. If licensee timely
14 requests a hearing, the Board will provide licensee with a
15 subsequent notice of the date, time and place of hearing. Licensee
16 may elect to be represented by counsel and to respond and present
17 evidence and argument on all issues involved. If licensee requests
18 a hearing, the procedures governing such a hearing will be provided
19 to the licensee prior to the date, time and place of hearing.
