         On December 26, 1997 the Oregon Board of Chiropractic
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    Examiners (OBCE) served a Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action

    (required continuing education and random review of patient

    files) against Joseph Cox, D.C., (Licensee). In the OBCE's

    notice that is incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A, the
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   OBCE proposed to require Licensee to obtain 24 hours of OBCE-

    approved continuing education courses on charting and coding, in

    addition to the annual hours that are required by the OBCE; and
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    submit to a random review by the OBCE of Licensee's patient files
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    to verify that Licensee's patient chart notes meet the minimum
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    standard set forth in OAR 811-015-0005 and the Oregon Practicing
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   Utilization Guidelines. The OBCE also proposed to assess against
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   Licensee the cost of this disciplinary proceeding.

         On January 12, 1998 Licensee filed an Answer to the Notice
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   of Disciplinary Action. It is incorporated herein by reference
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    as Exhibit B. Licensee generally denied OBCE's allegations and
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    asserted various affirmative defenses. Licensee also challenged
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   111
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- 1 the appropriateness of the OBCE's intent to impose disciplinary
- 2 proceeding costs against Licensee.
- 3.
- 4 On August 31, 1998 Licensee wrote to inform the OBCE,
- 5 through its counsel, that Licensee had completed approximately 12
- 6 hours of educational training. Licensee proposed to attend two
- 7 additional training sessions that totalled approximately 12 hours
- 8 of continuing education. For purposes of settlement, Licensee
- 9 asked the OBCE to approve Licensee's proposed 12 hours of
- 10 educational training. Licensee also agreed that the OBCE could
- 11 place Licensee on probation/supervision for a brief period so
- 12 that the OBCE could ascertain whether Licensee was implementing
- 13 his enhanced education.

- 15 At its regularly scheduled OBCE meeting, on September 24,
- 16 1998, the OBCE reviewed Licensee's August 31, 1998 letter, and
- 17 considered and discussed Licensee's settlement proposal.
- In order to informally dispose and settle this matter,
- 19 Licensee and the OBCE, by and through Dave McTeague, agree to
- 20 settle this matter through stipulation and agree that this
- 21 stipulation sets forth the facts upon which the parties have
- 22 agreed, the sanctions to be imposed, and the basis for the OBCE
- 23 final order in this matter under ORS 183.415.
- Licensee and the OBCE agree to the following facts:
- 25 a. Licensee's record keeping and chart notes did not
- 26 conform to the minimum standards required by the OBCE.

- b. Licensee received approximately 3 hours of educational
- 2 training in consultation, insurance billing and chart

- 7 d. Licensee received 3 hours of educational training at
- 8 Medicare Seminar #4912 on November 13, 1997.
- 9 CONCLUSION OF LAW
- 10 Licensee violated OAR 811-015-0005 by failing to comply
- 11 with the minimum standard requirements for patient records.
- 12 FINAL ORDER
- THEREFORE, pursuant to ORS 183.415(5) the OBCE ORDERS:
- 14 1. Licensee hereby placed on probation for six months
- 15 during which time Licensee is subject to the following
- 16 conditions:
- 17 a. Completion of 12 hours of continuing education courses
- 18 on charting and recordkeeping that are in addition to the annual
- 19 required hours.
- 20 b. Subjection to random reviews by the OBCE of its patient
- 21 files.
- 22 2. The OBCE assesses against Licensee the costs of this
- 23 disciplinary proceeding in the amount of \$ 1719.10.
- 24 3. Licensee agrees to waive all judicial review of this
- 25 Stipulated Final Order under ORS 183.415(5).
