STIPULATION

1.

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners has jurisdiction over the practice of chiropractic within the State of Oregon and of those persons, including Craig Dawson, who desire to engage in the practice of chiropractic. Dawson agrees that the Board of Chiropractic Examiners has jurisdiction over his license and may discipline him for the underlying factual events and circumstances which were the subject of an investigation and ultimate indictment by the Linn County grand jury concluding in a judgment of conviction and sentence, Case No. 89123233 entered on July 11, 1990 by Circuit Court Judge Jackson L. Frost.

2.

The Board and Dawson stipulate and agree that Dawson may be disciplined under the provisions of ORS 684.100(1)(d) in that he was convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude and under ORS 684.100(1)(g)(A) in that he engaged in unprofessional or dishonorable conduct by engaging in conduct which might constitute a danger to the safety of a patient or the public.

3.

The Board and Dawson stipulate and agree that this disciplinary

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1 action may be concluded by the entry of this Stipulation on the
2 following terms:

- 3 (a) Dawson is suspended from the practice of chiropractic in
4 the State of Oregon for a period of two years, retro-
5 active to the date on which Dawson turned in his active
6 license to practice chiropractic in Oregon;
- 7 (b) Dawson is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of
8 \$1,000;
- 9 (c) Dawson must successfully complete the terms of his
10 criminal probation;
- 11 (d) While holding an active license to practice chiropractic
12 within the State of Oregon or until otherwise ordered by
13 the Board, Dawson agrees to continue monthly counseling
14 sessions with a professional counselor acceptable to the
15 Board, and subject to the Board's prior approval, who
16 will provide a yearly report on Dawson's progress
17 beginning December 1991, all at Dawson's expense;
- 18 (e) While holding an active license to practice chiropractic
19 in the State of Oregon or until otherwise ordered by the
20 Board, Dawson will submit to yearly polygraph
21 examinations by a professional acceptable to the Board,
22 subject to prior approval by the Board, which polygraph
23 will contain questions approved by the Board or Board's
24 staff in advance relating to Dawson's compliance with
25 the terms of his probation, the terms of this
26 Stipulation, and particularly directed toward issues of

1 inappropriate sexual behavior. Said tests to be
2 conducted and reported entirely at Dawson's expense;
3 (f) Dawson agrees not to contradict the terms of this
4 Stipulation in any public or private communication.

5 4.

6 The terms of this Stipulation consist primarily of terms of
7 probation for Dr. Dawson's license. By agreeing to this
8 Stipulation, Dr. Dawson's license may be reinstated to active
9 status at his request, however, should he violate the terms of
10 this Stipulation, the Board may take immediate action against his
11 license, including suspension, revocation, limitation, and all
12 other terms available to the Board. Dr. Dawson would then be
13 entitled to a hearing as delineated in ORS chapter 684 and the
14 Administrative Procedures Act.
