The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating, and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Amy Eades, DC (Licensee) is licensed by the Board to practice as a chiropractic physician in the State of Oregon.

Findings of Fact

1.

The Board received complaints involving three chiropractic physicians employed by Licensee. The Board issued a notice of proposed disciplinary action against the chiropractic physicians, and Licensee as their employer. Allegations are incorporated herein by reference from the Notice of Proposed Discipline. Licensee denied the allegations in the Notice, and that she or the three chiropractic physicians failed to comply with Oregon's laws, rules, and regulations. Licensee requested a contested case hearing.

Conclusions of Law

2.

As the supervising doctor of the chiropractic clinics, Licensee is required (as are all Oregon licensed chiropractors) to keep records in accordance with Board requirements,

1 uphold patient confidentiality, and perform examinations with the competency required by
2 an Oregon chiropractic physician. The failure to do so are violations of the following: ORS
3 684.100.(1)(f)(A) and (B), OAR 811-015-0005(1)(c)(D) and (3) (a), and OAR 811-035-
4 0015(11) and (26).

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Stipulation

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3.

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Pursuant to ORS 183.417(3) and ORS 684.100(9)(e), the Board orders:

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10 a. The parties have agreed to enter this Stipulated Final Order. Licensee
11 agrees that she is aware of her right to a hearing with her attorney present to contest the
12 charges and hereby waives that right and agrees to entry of this order. Licensee agrees to
13 waive any right to appeal. The parties wish to settle and resolve the above matter without
14 further proceedings.

15 b. Licensee will pay a civil penalty of \$5,000. Payment in full is due within
16 30 days from the date this order is signed by the Board.

17 c. There will be no cost recovery sought by the Board.

18 d. If Licensee violates any of the terms of this order, the Board may consider
19 further discipline up to and including revocation.

20 This order is effective on the date signed by the Board and is a public record.
