REVOKING LICENSE 5 The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners moved to revoke б the license of James Bradley Gabrielson, a licensed chiropractor in the State of Oregon on April 17, 1990, for the 9 reasons stated in the Notice of Proposed License Revocation. 10 That Notice was personally served on James Bradley Gabrielson 11 by Dennis Fitz, Deputy Sheriff, Multnomah County Sheriff's 12 Office, at 12240 Northeast Glisan, Portland, Oregon, at 4:50 13 p.m. on May 25, 1990. Said Notice of Proposed License 14 Revocation was served with the Order of Immediate License 15 Suspension of James Bradley Gabrielson. Both the Suspension 16 and Notice of Proposed License Revocation were based on 17 numerous allegations of drug use and distribution, and on 18 Gabrielson's unreasonable abandonment of his practice in 19 Portland, Oregon. Gabrielson has not responded to either the Order 20 21 suspending his license or the Notice of Proposed Revocation 22 within the time allowed in the Order and Notice and by the 23 Administrative Procedures Act. Therefore, the Board now orders 24 the permanent revocation of James Bradley Gabrielson's license 25 to practice chiropractic within the state of Oregon by default 26 ///

B. Distribution of Cocaine - Danger to Patients

By conducting the unlawful cocaine purchase and sale in his office as described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, Licensee potentially exposed his patients to the danger to their health or safety of:

- (1) coming into injurious contact with one or more individual cocaine users who might be under its influence;
- (2) being exposed to the danger of violence involved in the execution of drug transactions and the apprehension of criminals.
- C. Use of Cocaine Impairment of Ability to Safely and Skillfully Practice

Licensee's unlawful possession and use of cocaine as described in paragraphs 1 and 3 above might impair Licensee's ability to safely and skillfully practice chiropractic.

6. The above described acts of Licensee present a serious danger to the health or safety of the public (including chiropractic consumers) for the reasons stated above and, unless suspended by the Board, Licensee likely would continue to so act and thereby would continue to present a serious danger to the health or safety of the public. If not so received, Licensee's right to a hearing 9 under ORS ch 183 will be waived.
