Case # 2007-5003 11 12 The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for 13 licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Thomas 14 Gilliland, D.C. (Licensee), is licensed by the Board to practice as a chiropractic physician in the 15 State of Oregon. The Board will discipline Licensee for the following reasons. 16 17 18 FINDINGS OF FACT 19 In response to a complaint, the Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners reviewed the patient 20 records of Patient 1 and found the records to be incomplete. 21 22 23 Licensee provided response to the Complaint, and in that response provided the chart notes of 24 Patient 1. 25 26 The Board reviewed the patient charts and found the following: 27 28 a. There were no notations in the chart of the patients past medical history. Patient 29 1 had a history of multiple types of surgeries which were not detailed in the charts. 30 b. There was no initial exam or examination findings on the visit of Patient 1 for August 31 32 c. The chart notes are substandard and below the standard of care for a chiropractic 33 physician in the state of Oregon. There is no treatment plan for the patient in the chart 34 notes. Treatment provided should reflect the patient's condition and response to 35 treatment. This was lacking in the chart notes. 36 37 38 On or about May 30, 2007, the Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action was served on Licensee 39 by Certified Mail. The 30 days in which to request a hearing expired on July 2, 2007. Licensee 40 did not request a hearing within that time period and is now in default. Licensee also notified the 41 Board by telephone on July 3, 2007 that he would not contest the Notice and would accept this 42

default order. The Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action stated that the record herein would be 1 2 relied on for purposes of default. 3 4 5 6 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW 7 5. 8 The Board finds that Licensee's record keeping on Patient 1 fell below the minimum standards in 9 violation of ORS 684.100 (1)(A); OAR 811-015-0005(1), and (1)(a). The Board finds that if a 10 new chiropractor were to assume care for this patient, the chiropractor wouldn't have the 11 necessary information to assure appropriate care. This is especially dangerous to public safety in 12 cases where a patient presents with multiple surgeries in their past. Past health information 13 affects the care presently. 14 15 16 ORDER 17 6. Due to the aforementioned violations, the OBCE is issuing a Letter of Reprimand, and 18 requires licensee to take a 6 hour course on recordkeeping in addition to the requirements of 19 continuing education for his regular renewal period. At the hearing, 18 Licensee may be represented by an attorney and subpoena and cross examine witnesses. That 19 request for hearing must be made in writing to the OBCE, must be received by the OBCE within 20 30 days from the mailing of this notice (or if not mailed, the date of personal service), and must 21 be accompanied by a written answer to the charges contained in this notice. 22 23 24 8. 25 The answer shall be made in writing to the OBCE and shall include an admission or 26 denial of each factual matter alleged in this notice, and a short plain statement of each relevant 27 affirmative defense Licensee may have. Except for good cause, factual matters alleged in this 28 notice and not denied in the answer will be considered a waiver of such defense; new matters 29 alleged in this answer (affirmative defenses) shall be presumed to be denied by the agency and 30 evidence shall not be taken on any issue not raised in the notice and answer. 31 32 33 9. 34 If Licensee requests a hearing, before commencement of that hearing, Licensee will be 35 given information on the procedures, rights of representation and other rights of the parties 36 relating to the conduct of the hearing as required under ORS 183.413-415. 37 38 39 10. 40 If Licensee fails to request a hearing within 30 days, or fails to appear as scheduled at the 41 hearing, the OBCE may issue a final order by default and impose the above sanctions against 42 Licensee. Upon default order of the Board or failure to appear, the contents of the Board's file 43
