STIPULATED FINAL ORDER

Case # 2004-5003

The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board or OBCE) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. LaTisha Nicole Henderson (Applicant) is an applicant for licensure as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant (CCA).

1.

On July 15, 2004, the OBCE received applicant's application which included an explanation for a previous conviction. Court records show in 1997 Applicant had fraudulently obtained an Oregon Identification Card in a false name and used it to cash a check which she found. In addition, when arrested, Applicant had several rocks of crack cocaine in her purse and admitted to the arresting officer she had been using it for the past two years. She entered into a drug treatment program and was not convicted of any drug violations.

Applicant was convicted of a felony, Forgery I on 11/5/97. Applicant also has a misdemeanor conviction record for 6/23/99 for misuse of an ID card when she attempted to get an ID card with a fake birth certificate at the Clackamas DMV. On 2/3/04 applicant was convicted of three violations; illegally altering a display plate on a vehicle, improper display of a valid plate sticker and driving uninsured.

On August 6, 2004, applicant was sent a Notice of Proposed Condition on Licensee and proposed under the provisions of ORS 684.100 (1) (d) and ORS 670.280, that applicant be granted certification with the condition that she must disclose this conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom he seeks employment and abide by all terms listed in her probation.

3.

Stipulations

This matter having come properly before and been considered by the Board, and Licensee having voluntarily stipulated and consented to the issuance and entry of this order by signing below,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Applicant will be granted her license to practice as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant.
2. Applicant must disclose her conviction history to any and all chiropractic physicians with whom she seeks employment by providing a copy of this Stipulated Final Order.
3. Failure to abide by the terms of this Stipulated Final Order will result, after investigation and due process, in the revocation of her (CCA) license.
4. By signing this stipulation Applicant understands that she has been advised of her right to request a hearing on this matter and agrees to waive this right to a hearing or appeal of this matter.
