Case # 2010-5006 11 12 13 14 The Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Allen 15 Hutcheson, D.C. (Licensee), is licensed by the Board to practice as a chiropractic physician in the 16 State of Oregon. 17 18 19 Findings of Fact 20 21 22 1. From February 2009 through May 2010, Licensee employed worker 1 as a chiropractic 23 24 assistant. Worker 1 was not certified as a Certified Chiropractic Assistant, but Licensee was providing her with on the job training in hopes that she would become certified. Initially when 25 hired Licensee was almost always in the room with her while she performed the therapies. 26 However, as time went by, it happened more and more often that Licensee left the room and 27 would leave worker 1 to finish the task. Worker 1 thought she was suppose to have a certificate 28 before being left alone in the room to perform therapies. 29 30 2. 31 32 Licensee told the Board during the investigation that he did not always directly supervise 33 worker 1. He gave no excuse and said he realized the violation when he read it on the 34 "Guidelines for Chiropractic Assistant Applicant's initial training by the supervising DC." 35 Licensee apologized and said okay when he was told by Board staff that he could not allow her to 36 perform therapies while unsupervised. In a letter provided to the Board at a later date, Licensee 37 then stated that worker 1 was allowed to do some therapies after he had left the room, but was 38 fully trained and that he was still on the premises. 39

11	Due to the aforementioned violations, Licensee is required to pay a \$500 civil penalty to
12	the OBCE. Licensee has satisfied this obligation.

16	1. The parties have agreed to enter this stipulated final order. Licensee agrees to the
17	entering of this final order. Licensee agrees that he is aware of his right to a hearing with
18	his attorney present to contest the charges and hereby waives that right and agrees to entr
19	of this order. The signature of this order also waives any right to appeal. The parties
20	wish to settle and resolve the above matter without further proceedings.
21	2. Licensee has the civil penalty in the sum of \$500.
22	3. Failure to complete this final stipulated order with the terms so stated, may result in
23	further discipline.
