22 Licensee signed her Renewal Notice and Affidavit on June 23, 2008 and Licensee
23 affirmed that she had completed the required 20 continuing education hours required for license
24 renewal. The renewal application stated "I swear, and affirm that during the previous license
25 year, I completed the required number of CE credits for my license status and my signature below
26 verifies that all information hereon is true and correct." Licensee was required to complete the
27 continuing education hours by July 31, 2007.

30 Upon audit and review by the Board of the credits that were actually taken by Licensee
31 during the required period, of the 20 that were required Licensee was missing 4 hours of CE
32 credits. Once Licensee was aware of the Board Audit, Licensee took additional hours in a good
33 faith effort to respond to the audit, however, those were not accomplished during the time period
34 required. Those hours were completed in October 2008. In addition, Licensee was not able to
35 provide evidence of completion of the 2 hour requirement for Evidence Based Outcomes
36 Measures.

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40 On January 23, 2009 a Notice of Proposed Civil Penalty was sent to Licensee at her address of
41 record. Licensee contacted the OBCE on February 18, 2009 and indicated she will not be
42 contesting the proposed order.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Due to the aforementioned violations Licensee is assessed a \$450 civil penalty. For the next three years following renewal, Licensee will be included in the continuing education compliance audit. Licensee will provide evidence of completion of the 2 hour requirement for Evidence Based Outcomes Measures.
