) CONSENT ORDER

The Oregon Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereafter "Board") is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating and disciplining chiropractic physicians in the State of Oregon. Jason C. Morris (hereafter "applicant"), is currently licensed by the Board as a certified chiropractic assistant and is an applicant for doctor of chiropractic license in Oregon. He has had a chiropractic license in Arizona since 2000.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1.

Applicant has provided information to the Board concerning his convictions for DUI in Arizona, one of which was an extreme DUI. This resulted in a fine, ten days in jail, 36 hours of alcohol counseling, and evaluation by Dr. Michel A. Sucher MD, an addictionologist. Applicant attended 16 AA meetings as part of his counseling program. Dr. Sucher's recommendations are for further evaluation with continued treatment, or alternatively diagnostic monitoring for the purpose of ruling out a diagnosis of alcohol dependence.

2.

Applicant appeared before the Board at their May 18, 2006 meeting to address these issues. Applicant appears before the Arizona Board of Chiropractic Examiners on June 8, 2006.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The above described conduct of Applicant violates ORS 684.100(1)(f) , ORS 684.100. (1)(g)(A), and OAR 811-035-0015(13).

CONSENT ORDER

4.

Applicant and the Board agree to the entry of this Consent Order, which provides that Applicant shall comply with the following as a condition on his Oregon chiropractic license:

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1. Applicant agrees he will refrain from alcohol or use medications or drugs that were not properly prescribed for a therapeutic purpose for twelve months. During this time Applicant agrees to undergo random urine drug screens with a comprehensive panel of drugs specifically tested for health by Recovery Support Services (Rick Weidlich, 503-892-9717). Licensee agrees that a medical review officer, arranged through Mr. Weidlich, will interpret the results of the drug screens. The frequency of the tests shall be determined by Recovery Support Services, or at a rate of not less than once a month. These will be at Applicant's expense.
2. Applicant agrees to fully comply with the terms of the Arizona Board of Chiropractic Examiners decision in their Case # 2006-005, as a condition of his Oregon chiropractic license, including any provision that he maintain an active Arizona chiropractic license in good standing.
3. Applicant agrees that failure to fully comply with either this Consent Agreement or any order from the Arizona Board of Chiropractic Examiners may result in disciplinary action by the Board.
4. Applicant shall instruct all health care providers participating in any treatment program to respond promptly to any Board inquiry concerning Applicant's compliance with the treatment plan.
5. Applicant shall waive any privilege with respect to any physical or psychological evaluation or treatment in favor of the Board for the purposes to determine compliance with this Order and shall execute any waiver or release upon request from the Board.
