Nickila agrees that, between August 13, 1990, and September 22 12, 1990, he engaged in practices which constitute the practice of 23 chiropractic, in spite of the Board's order suspending him. 24 agrees that he will not practice chiropractic at any time in the 25 future except when he is actively licensed to do so, including, but 26 not limited to:
