Dear Dr. Stoltz:

Our records show that you have not come into compliance regarding the renewing of your license.

Your payment of \$160 was received in this office August 29, 1990 and the continuing education hours received September 14, 1990. However, the deadline for receiving both the continuing education hours and payment was August 31, 1990. Since the continuing education hours were not received by the deadline, a penalty of one-half (\$80) the licensing fee was assessed, see ORS 684.090.

Our records show that the \$80 penalty has <u>not</u> been paid. Your license cannot be issued until the penalty is paid. Therefore, your license is expired and you must cease and desist from practicing chiropractic in the State of Oregon until you comply with the law.

In the Matter of) EVIDENTIARY RULING, FINDINGS OF FACT, ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF WILLIAM STOLTZ, D.C.) FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, ORDER AND NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This contested case was heard by the entire Board of Chiropractic Examiners (Board) on May 16, 1991. Licensee was represented by Brian Barnes, Attorney at Law, and the Board was not represented by an attorney. The Board has considered the evidence and exhibits and makes the following disposition of this contested case:

EVIDENTIARY RULING

At the time of the hearing, attorney Brian Barnes, offered lists of exhibits Resp.A and Resp.B, Resp.1 and Resp.2, and a Memorandum of Facts and Law in addition to the testimony of licensee, William Stoltz. At the time of the hearing the Presiding Officer ruled that the evidence, with the exception of Resp.1 and Resp.2, would be made a part of the record. Resp.1 and Resp.2 were not accepted into the record.

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board mailed a notice of the requirements of ORS 684.092 which stated that the annual registration fee was due on August 1, 1990, to the licensee on May 31, 1990. The licensee, William Stoltz, paid his license renewal fee on August 29, 1990. The Board received proof that licensee William Stoltz completed his continuing education requirements on September 14, 1990. The Board received the written application of licensee and the payment of the additional one-half of the annual registration fee on November 5,

additional one-half of the annual registration fee on November 5, 1990. The license of William Stoltz expired on August 31, 1990, and was not renewed until November 5, 1990. Licensee William Stoltz 3 submitted bills to SAIF, a workers' compensation insurance company, 4 for chiropractic services rendered to patients 5 October 18, 1990; William Nordstrom on September 5, 1990, September 6 27, 1990, and October 4, 1990. At the time that the chiropractic 7 services to the above-listed patients were rendered the license of 8 William Stoltz was expired. 9 ULTIMATE FINDINGS OF FACT 10 William Stoltz practiced chiropractic during the time when his 11 license had expired. 12 CONCLUSION OF LAW 13 William Stoltz violated the provisions of ORS 684.015(1)(a). 14 ORDER 15 Licensee William Stoltz is ordered to pay a fine of \$300 and a letter of reprimand shall be placed in his permanent license file. 17 18 6-5 1991.
